A man and his wife were having some problems at home and were giving each other the silent treatment. The next week, the man realized that he would need his wife to wake him at 5 a.m. for an early-morning business flight to Chicago. Not wanting to be the first to break the silence (and lose), he wrote on a piece of paper, "Please wake me at 5 a.m." The next morning the man woke up, only to discover it was 9 a.m. and he had missed his flight. Furious, he was about to go and see why his wife hadn't awakened him when he notice a piece of paper by the bed. The paper read, "It is 5 a.m. Wake-up."

What went wrong? They punished each other by not talking! Does the silent treatment really work? Not really. When we stop talking to each other we lose a vital link in communication. The same is true when we stop talking to God. Maybe we have financial problems. A divorce. A family member's death. It hurt us and we stop talking to God.

Our silence actually causes our relationship with God to worsen and deepens our woundedness. Yes, God says "Be still and know that I am God." But the silence we're speaking about here is not for worship reasons. Silence that arises out of anger, bitterness or resentment serves only to punish. Do you remember when you were little and you stopped speaking to a friend? It wasn't the awe of worship that created the silence. Instead, it was anger. "He took my toy!" "She's mean to me!" "I don't like her!" Childish, isn't it? Aren't we, as adults, mature enough to "talk through" our problems or disappointments?

Let me encourage you to keep talking to God. Maybe you are deeply wounded by a situation in your life. Perhaps a little disappointment seeps into your home. Keep talking to

God. As Jesus said, "Without Him, I can do nothing." But together? Together, great things happen. When we keep praying, we keep a vital link. When we keep praying, we find the answers that we need. When we keep praying, we enjoy a sense of being loved by God. Be careful not to let silence rob you of a loving relationship with God. Keep on praying!
