I Thessalonians 1: 1-10

Words: role models. Paul talks to the Thessalonian church about "what kind of persons we proved to be among you for your sake" (1: 5). Paul, Silvanus and Timothy brought them the message not only in word, but also in power and in the Holy Spirit with conviction.



But this good role modeling did not end with Paul and his colleagues. No, in this letter, Paul reports the Thessalonians "become imitators of us and of the Lord, for in spite of persecution you received the word with joy inspired by the Holy Spirit, so that you became an example to all the believers in Macedonia and Achaia (vss. 6-7).

Role modeling is as essential now as it was then. It is up to us to rise to the occasion. What kind of role model are you? Are you reading your Bible? Do you share your faith? Do you use appropriate language around your children, family and friends? When was the last time they saw you place a check in the offering plate? Was it a tithe or "leftovers?" We have a church and faith community that is in need of role models. Our children, young adults and young Christians are challenged to grow when they see us in Bible studies, attending prayer vigils, sharing our faith and giving sacrificially to the Lord. It's really hard to be inspired by role models who attend church sporadically and not consistently. Remember, our faith is more than just words. It means being an example.

This is why the Emmaus Community is such a powerful renewal movement in the church. The Emmaus community is an example of Christian discipleship and spiritual growth. We are the leaders that help others move beyond a babyish spirituality to a spirituality with depth. Our role model inspires others to "not just talk, but walk the walk." Both laity are clergy are called to live out Christ's love in the world. This a great calling! It is up to us to rise to the occasion. Today someone is watching you. What will they see? Go forth and inspire them!
