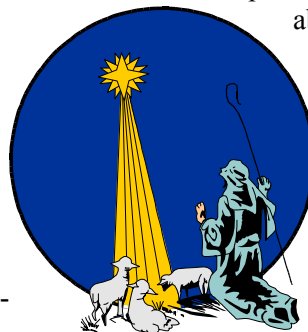
BRAKE FOR CHRISTMAS
