A Moment from our Community Spiritual Director

In the Book of Acts, Luke writes that on the day of Pentecost after Peter preached and thousands accepted Jesus Christ as Lord and Savior the following happened among those who believed:

"They devoted themselves to the apostles' teaching and to the fellowship, to the breaking of bread and to prayer. Everyone was filled with awe, and many wonders and miraculous signs were done by the apostles. All the believers were together and had everything in common. Selling their possessions and goods, they gave to anyone as he had need. Every day they continued to meet together in the temple courts. They broke bread in their homes and ate together with glad and sincere hearts, praising God and enjoying the favor of all the people. And the Lord added to their number daily those who were being saved."

As members of the Emmaus community, we are called to become leaders within the local church. The Walk to Emmaus movement has had a tremendous impact within the Church in raising up leaders. BUT, we are also called worship, pray, serve and fellowship together as an Emmaus community. Each month we gather to share in fellowship and worship together. We send prayer requests to the community through email. We are called serve by

offering agape gifts for Men's and Women's Walks, Chrysalis Flights and Keryx weekends. We are called to serve in many different positions auxiliary, conference room, etc. on Emmaus Walks. We are called to offer others the opportunity to participate in the Walk to Emmaus experience.

When was the last time you came to an Emmaus gathering, attended a candlelight or closing or sponsored someone on a Walk? If Emmaus had such a great impact on your faith and your spiritual journey, then what is keeping you from helping our community to grow strong in Christ? We need your support. As this is written, two Walks to Emmaus Teams are being formed and Team Meetings have started.

A reminder:

- Men's Walk to Emmaus #60 will be held at Clare UMC, September 16th 19th
- Women's Walk to Emmaus #61 will be held at Mt. Hope UMC, October 14th 17th

We would like to encourage you to start the process NOW of sponsoring a Pilgrim for those two Walks.

As you know, historically, Men's Walks to Emmaus generally have an average of about 22 at each Walk; and last fall, a Walk had to be postponed until this Spring because a sufficient number of Pilgrims were not registered for the Fall Walk to justify conducting it then.

We have accepted the invitation to be Lay Directors for the Women's and Men's Walks respectively and we want to especially encourage you to start NOW in prayer to seek God's guidance about who YOU should sponsor for the Fall Walks to Emmaus.

(If you haven't had Sponsor Training in the last four (4) years, the Lansing Emmaus Community Board of Directors encourages you to do so before you sponsor this Fall. The BOD is committed to having Sponsors complete training at least every four (4) years. The responsibility is so critical they do not want to leave it to chance that you will be a good sponsor. The act of sponsorship is an intentional and responsible undertaking...please take it seriously and deliberately.

Sponsor Training is conducted after the Devotion and Communion component of the monthly (2nd Saturday each month) Gatherings, held at Trinity UMC in Lansing. If you are unable to complete the training before the Walks, seek a CO-SPONSOR who has completed the training within the last four years to help you.

Completing the Training is also a responsible act.

Remember, that someone thought you were special enough in their life to SPONSOR YOU.

HANDBOOK MOMENT

This is the first article in a series of articles designed to familiarize Lansing Area Emmaus Community members with the Emmaus "model" or "handbook." The Lansing Area Board of Directors sign an agreement each year with the Upper Room agreeing to follow the handbook that is provided to the board. This handbook was thoughtfully put together and provides understanding for the many parts of this movement.

The focus for this newsletter will be on Chapter 8 "The Spirit of the Walk to Emmaus"

"The spirit in which the Walk to Emmaus is conducted is none other than the Holy Spirit. In Galatians 5:22-26, Paul lists the characteristics of the Holy Spirit manifested in people's attitudes and behavior, which he calls 'fruit of the Spirit.' This fruit also represents the character of an (Emmaus) team properly formed in the spirit of Jesus Christ."

The fruit of the Spirit, of course, is love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness, and self-control. This chapter of the handbook presents a page or so for each of the nine characteristics, and explains how each is best modeled on an Emmaus walk. For this article, love will be the characteristic that is discussed.

LOVE

"The weekend community should be characterized by an atmosphere of hospitality and acceptance. The pilgrims should feel that the Walk is an open and opportune space in which they can respond freely and honestly to the gospel of grace in the presence of people who care, a time in which they can rediscover themselves in relationship with God."

"..this love draws attention to God---not to team members. An ancient image depicts the spiritual life as a wagon wheel with spokes connecting at the center. The center represents God in Jesus Christ, and the wheel rim represents people. As we turn and are drawn to the center, we are, at the same time, drawn closer to one another. BUT when we attempt to move closer to one another on our own, along the rim of human need and natural inclination, we do not necessarily move closer to God. Nor do we necessarily move closer to lasting, spiritual relationships with one another. THE AIM OF THE WALK TO EMMAUS IS TO TURN PEOPLE'S ATTEN-TION TOWARD GOD, SO THEYMAY BE DRAWN CLOSER TO GOD, AND IN THE PROCESS DRAWN TOGETHER AS SPIRITUAL FRIENDS INTO A CHRIS-TIAN COMMUNITY OF THE HOLY SPIRIT'S MAKING.

"God, not the team members themselves, will draw the pilgrims together as their attention is turned to God's welcoming love and as their hearts overflow with the gift of that love in the company of one another."
