Insights from the Emmaus Handbook Month 2 - JOY

In last month's newsletter we looked at the Emmaus Walk being characterized by an atmosphere of hospitality and acceptance and love. This month, we will look at what the Emmaus Handbook has to say about the Walk to Emmaus being full of occasions of true joy.

JOY – now there's a word for you. I've heard many sermons on joy and I'm still not quite sure what it is. I know that it is NOT happiness – that's the big point of most sermons on the subject that I have heard. It is present despite circumstances for those who have this fruit of the Spirit. It is not something that I have really quite gotten down yet! I do remember, however, having joy often during my 72 hours back in 1997 when I took my walk and I'm sure that you do as well.

WHAT THE HANDBOOK SAYS

"There are many times of joy during a walk including the joy of singing, self-expression, uninhibited laughter, insight, liberation from the shackles of sin or inner hurt or murderous anger. There is the joy of knowing God's presence, of feeling accepted, of finally giving one's life wholeheartedly and without reservation to Jesus Christ. Joy on the walk to Emmaus comes in moments of seriousness and in moments of great fun. "

"The team should be careful, however, that the expression of joy in fun does not give way to boisterousness and getting "carried away." This can happen when jokes get out of hand, when people make fun of one another, or pilgrims are dominated by the team members' having fun among themselves: too much sarcasm can poison the atmosphere. Extroverts can take over the weekend in such a way that the introverts feel left out and unable to participate. It also happens when negative traditions are started by a community to "liven up the walk". The walk is already lively and full of occasions for expression of true joy. Team leaders need to be aware of the team's influence on the atmosphere of the weekend and share concerns at the nightly meetings."

Yes, it is true. I remember many times of joy during my walk and the walks on which I worked – most especially in the auxiliary! What a joy to serve anonymously, realizing the joy that the work behind the scenes will bring to pilgrims who are totally unaware of it! Joy is a fruit of the Spirit and not something that is manufactured by us to liven up a walk or make others happy. It cannot be forced, but is lavished upon us when the Holy Spirit freely moves without our help. May all the Lansing Area Emmaus Community Walks be times of joy for the pilgrims, their families, the auxiliary, and the conference room teams.

From <u>My Utmost for His Highest, Oswald Chambers</u> <u>– March 5</u> Joy comes from seeing the complete fulfillment of the specific purpose for which I was created and born again, not from successfully doing something of my own choosing. The joy our Lord experienced came from doing what the Father sent Him to do. And He says to us, "As the Father has sent Me, I also send you"

... so that I may finish my race with joy, and the ministry which I received from the Lord Jesus ... —Acts 20:24

I urge you to do a word study on joy in your Bible and to prayerfully consider what you discover.

We would like to encourage you to start the process NOW of sponsoring a Pilgrim for those two Walks.

As you know, historically, Men's Walks to Emmaus generally have an average of about 22 at each Walk; and last fall, a Walk had to be postponed until this Spring because a sufficient number of Pilgrims were not registered for the Fall Walk to justify conducting it then.

We have accepted the invitation to be Lay Directors for the Women's and Men's Walks respectively and we want to especially encourage you to start NOW in prayer to seek God's guidance about who YOU should sponsor for the Fall Walks to Emmaus.

(If you haven't had Sponsor Training in the last four (4) years, the Lansing Emmaus Community Board of Directors encourages you to do so before you sponsor this Fall. The BOD is committed to having Sponsors complete training at least every four (4) years. The responsibility is so critical they do not want to leave it to chance that you will be a good sponsor. The act of sponsorship is an intentional and responsible undertaking...please take it seriously and deliberately.

Sponsor Training is conducted after the Devotion and Communion component of the monthly (2nd Saturday each month) Gatherings, held at Trinity UMC in Lansing. If you are unable to complete the training before the Walks, seek a CO-SPONSOR who has completed the training within the last four years to help you.

Completing the Training is also a responsible act.

Remember, that someone thought you were special enough in their life to SPONSOR YOU.

Spiritual Directors Report

Steve Laue in Shepherd's Diary wrote, "For some reason, pigs and money go together. As in piggybank. As in "bring home the bacon." As in "living high on the hog." And even though "you can't make a silk purse out of a sow's ear," your mind's eye will picture a pigskin pocketbook the rest of the afternoon once you've heard that porcine proverb. Even in the life of the church, pork meets penny. The term STEWARD traces back to the medieval English "STY-WARD." Yep, a pig-keeper.

Jesus talked a lot about stewards and stewardship. Unfortunately for the purposes of this article, the Hebrew word for steward had nothing to do with pig farming (which, after all, just isn't kosher). And, the one encounter Jesus had with a pig farmer wasn't exactly good stewardship (all that deviled ham and nobody got to eat it -- Luke 8:32-35). Never mind the pigs, stewardship of money was a very important topic to Jesus. If you get the Bible out and do a little figuring of your own, you will find that one-sixth of Jesus' words have to do with money -- the only subject he talks about more is the kingdom of God"

As an Emmaus Community we are about the Kingdom of God. Our ministry is to help develop leaders for the Kingdom of God, and God is using our community in a powerful way to raise up those leaders. BUT, we can't overlook the fact that in order to run our ministry funds are needed. Just as costs are rising for each of us to maintain our personal lives where 'pork meets penny', costs are rising to meet the needs for each Emmaus Walk we hold.

We need your help as God's stewards. Our funds are low. We are struggling financially. There are lots of 'gimmicks' I could come up with to get you to give a financial gift, but I'm not going to to do that.
