Insights from the Emmaus Handbook Week 4 Patience

Three months ago, we looked at the weekend community being characterized by an atmosphere of hospitality and acceptance and love. Two months ago, we looked at what the Emmaus Handbook has to say about the Walk to Emmaus being full of occasions of true joy. Last month the topic was peace, which comes from a faith in and vital relationship with God. This month we will look at patience and the Emmaus Walk.

From the Handbook: "The three-day Walk to Emmaus is a full but very slow walk with the Lord. Even though the pilgrims follow the same path, each one's experience is unique. The pilgrims hear and see the Lord in their own way, according to their needs and God's will for them at the time of the Walk".

"Team members are called to have patience, not only with the pilgrims but with the work of the Lord in the process. The pilgrims are repeatedly told 'don't anticipate', yet sometimes team members need to hear this call for patience more than the pilgrims. The pilgrims are told on Friday night that no formula response is expected of them, that each person's response will be individual. But for this to be true, team members have to let go of their own expectations for the events and replace them with the prayer of thanksgiving for God's grace already at work in each life. Team members get in the way of the Holy Spirit when they try to fulfill their own expectations for the weekend. The team members are patient when their manner communicates an accepting space in which the

pilgrims feel free to respond authentically to God's presence."

May the Holy Spirit always be free to work in the process and lives of those who take the 72-hour Walk to Emmaus and may we not get in the way of that work! Oswald Chambers says this beautifully in his devotional, My Utmost for His Highest – May 5.


A spiritually minded person will never come to you with the demand—"Believe this and that"; a spiritually-minded person will demand that you align your life with the standards of Jesus. We are not asked to believe the Bible, but to believe the One whom the Bible reveals (see John 5:39-40).


Always measure your life solely by the standards of Jesus. Submit yourself to His yoke, and His alone; and always be careful never to place a yoke on others that is not of Jesus Christ. It takes God a long time to get us to stop thinking that unless everyone sees things exactly as we do, they must be wrong. That is never God's view. There is only one true liberty—the liberty of Jesus at work in our conscience enabling us to do what is right.

Don't get impatient with others. Remember how God dealt with you—with patience and with gentleness. But never water down the truth of God. Let it have its way and never apologize for it. Jesus said, "Go... and make *disciples*..." (Matthew 28:19), not, "Make converts to your own thoughts and opinions."


