

Emmaus Communities are

Sponsorship—from the viewpoint of the Registrar Based on the Upper Room Handbook!

The Emmaus experience passes from person to person reflecting the relational nature of God and the manner in which God reaches out to people through people. A Walk to Emmaus experience is an amazing GIFT. However, the Walk to Emmaus is NOT for everyone!

As a good sponsor you should use discernment in recruiting pilgrims, keeping in mind the TRUE purpose of Emmaus--the development of Christian leaders and the renewal of the church in ministry.

A good sponsor should:

- 1. PRAY
- 2. Have participated in a Walk to Emmaus (or other affiliated event such as Chrysalis, Tres Dias, DeColores)
- 3. Have taken sponsorship training in the last 4 years.
- 4. Have not sponsored more than 2 pilgrims per year with a few exceptions.
- 5. Have reviewed the Emmaus library series booklet, "Sponsorship".
- 6. Use discernment to select an excellent pilgrim candidate.

NOTE: Emmaus is not for non-Christians; those w/ incompatible theological, spiritual or dietary beliefs/ traditions; those undergoing an unstable time in their lives such as family breakup, job loss, or extreme grief; those who just need to be 'loved'; church hoppers (disgruntled with every church they attend); or those looking for yet 'another spiritual high'.

- 7. Make an appointment w/ the candidate (and spouse if married) to fully explain the basic elements of a Walk to Emmaus (structured, cloistered, ecumenical, focused on God) and explain Equal Commitment to both spouses. There are no secrets—but many nice surprises—so it is your goal to explain enough to meet their needs, but try not to spoil the surprises which are part of the experience.
- 8. Provide a current registration form to the candidate and help them fill it out answering questions as necessary. Get the deposit or walk fee from the pilgrim.
- 9. Complete the sponsorship agreement and sponsor's portion of the application and mail with application & deposit to the Registrar IMMEDIATELY or at LEAST THREE WEEKS PRIOR to walk.
- 10. Enlist support of the pilgrim's pastor; get 8-12 agape letters (no more & no gifts)
- 11. Be fully able to commit to the responsibilities of sponsorship by supporting the walk through the 72 hour prayer vigil, send off, sponsors hour, candlelight, closing, transporting pilgrim to and from walk and caring for home issues they might have such as family, pets, plants, home security. **NOTE**: sponsors should not serve as team members on the walk. It is difficult to meet the responsibilities of both roles & your presence in the conference room may interfere with the pilgrim's special interaction with God or distract them from a full and personal response to the walk.
- 12. After the walk, encourage the pilgrim with 4th day involvement take them to the reunion Gathering, help them find a reunion group, & help them re-enter their church to use their new enthusiasm and energy!
- 13. Inform the pilgrim of ways to serve the Emmaus community. Remember, you have a sponsor commitment to this pilgrim for at least one year.

14. PRAY REMEMBER

When you sign the sponsorship portion of a pilgrim's application, we are taking it on FAITH that you have met these promises of a good sponsor!!!

Insights from the Emmaus Handbook

Week 5 Kindness

In past newsletters we have looked at love, joy, peace, and patience relating to the Emmaus experience. This month: kindness. The Greek word is **chrestotes** {khray-stot'-ace}...

- a. This word describes "the sympathetic kindliness or sweetness of temper which puts others at their ease, and shrinks from giving pain" (PLUMMER)
- 1) It therefore describes a quality that makes other people feel at ease when with you
- 2) They know you will be kind, or gentle b. "It is a beautiful word for the expression of a beautiful grace" (TRENCH) (Mark A. Copeland) http://www.ccel.org/contrib/ exec outlines/fs/fs 13.htm

This is a very important part of what Emmaus is about!

From the Emmaus Handbook:

"Kindness is love expressed in specific acts of caring, attention, and undeserved charity. The pilgrims experience the kindness of God through the attention of the team and the Emmaus community to the pilgrims' every need and their extraordinary care for the many details Assistant Community Lay Director that make Emmaus so special a gift."

"Few other programs involve the investment of so much from so many for the sake of so few. Team members must be careful, however, that kindness does not turn into control. Pilgrims do not experience the kindness of God when the team's attention becomes smothering watchfulness. The pilgrims may then feel they are being treated like children or like prisoners who cannot be trusted."

"Team and community helpers must also be careful not to call attention to their acts of kindness, even at Closing. The Weekend Lay Director may briefly recognize the persons who have contributed (but not single out individuals) so that pilgrims have the opportunity to express their gratitude. At closing the focus remains upon the pilgrims and God's work in their lives."

Over and over again, the handbook stresses that it is not about US! We are to be servants showing God's love to the pilgrims. Kindness is one very important way to show God's love and help pilgrims feel comfortable and safe in their experience during their 72-hour experience, while at the same time not drawing attention to ourselves.
