My name is John Lord, I took my Walk to Emmaus in May of 1994, at Lawrence Avenue Methodist Church and sat at the Table of Timothy. I now serve you as Sponsorship/ Candlelight/ Closing/ Music Coordinator. Sponsoring and the training of sponsors is what I'd like to talk about. Emmaus sees sponsorship as the most important job of all. It is more than "signing up people", each possible pilgrim should be carefully considered. So who do we sponsor, and just as important, who don't we sponsor?

#### We should sponsor:

- · Church leaders (clergy and laypeople),
- Dependable workers, the backbone of the church.
- · Christians who are hungry for something more and who wish to grow spiritually.

These are just a few for you to think about sponsoring. Emmaus is right for many - but not for everyone. **Those** who we should not actively sponsor would include:

- Non-Christians. We are to revitalize the church, not attempt to convert non believers.
- Christians whose theology would require them to defend the uniqueness of their beliefs throughout the Walk, or persons who do not share belief in traditional doctrines of the major denominations of the church.
- "Church hoppers" who have an axe to grind, or would use Emmaus to further their own theological agendas, or who would want to create an "Emmaus church".
- Persons who are always looking for another spiritual high to help them "arrive" or "find themselves"

Sponsorship training is offered before Candlelight, at every gathering, and whenever anyone wishes it and our schedules coincide. There will also be training at the Men's Reunion May 13.

#### Grace and the Cost of Meals for Community Members During the Walks

During the walks, there has been some confusion regarding who is to pay for meals and how much they are to cost. The answer is: <u>Everyone</u> on an Emmaus Walk pays for their meals. We have heard the story of the Bread and Fishes. Jesus asked a young boy with five fish and two loaves of bread to give them to him so he could feed a multitude. During the walk we are trying to spiritually feed our pilgrims. Since we are not Jesus, we cannot perform such miracles He can do that. Amen

Many wonderful blessings have occurred over the years. Sometimes ground beef for an entire meal has miraculously appeared, or desserts have been baked off site and given as an agape gift. On a recent walk all of the eggs were donated. That's a whole lot of eggs! Personally, I now look at chickens as an instrument of God. The Lord always seems to supply what is needed when it is needed. Amen.

If you are working a walk, the cost of meals for the entire weekend is \$35.00. If you are planning on working part of the weekend, the cost is \$5.00 per meal. If you are serving on the Saturday evening dinner, the cost is \$7.00. Please bear in mind that the pilgrims are the first and foremost reason that we are having these walks, and consequently they are to be served first. If we do not have enough for visiting Auxiliary staff to eat, please remember that you have the opportunity and ability to leave the church and go out to eat. The pilgrims do not. Your payment should be given to the Auxiliary Head of the Walk.

Please give grace to the kitchen staff on this issue, if it should befall that you might not get a meal as an Auxiliary worker. But for planning purposes please alert the Head Cook and or the Auxiliary Head as soon as possible. Blessings to all who read this and may your steps be secure in the Lord. GLYASDI.
