Did you hear the story about the construction workers hired to work on a building project? One was in charge of laying the foundation, another was in charge of the electrical, another the lumber and the fourth providing all of the supplies. A couple of days later, the construction leader arrived to check on the job only to find that nothing had been done. Not only was there no progress, but nothing had been started. The leader called all of the workers together to find out what happened (or in this case, what had not happened). Everyone came together with the exception of the supply person. No one knew where he was. In fact no one had seen him since the beginning of the job. Suddenly, out from behind several huge crates, jumped the supply person, who started yelling at the top of his lungs, "SURPRISE! SURPRISE!" He thought he heard that he was in charge of the "surprise-e's", not the "supplies!"

Well we the LAE Community do not want to be caught in a "surprise" when it comes to supplies for a Walk and especially when it comes to the Supply Trailer. On your Walk, did you ever wonder where all of the dining room decorations, tissue or notebooks came from? Our supply coordinator knows. All of this and much, much more where purchased and loaded on to the LAE Supply Trailer before the Walk, then hauled to the Church where your Walk was held. Our supply person, Lyle Ball looked over the current trailer that has served our Community for many, many years. The roof is deteriorating badly and the entire structure is in bad shape. It would be a shame if it rained and items inside the trailer were ruined. Even though Lyle plans to do some much needed repair work this summer, long range planning must be done.

Lyle has looked into new trailers and the minimum size to do the job and to allow for some expansion is a 26.4 X 8 trailer. He located one that will do well and will cost approximately \$7,000. That is a lot of money. However, we believe that we have a fresh new push from God to carry the message of servant leadership to the communities that we live in. And the Supply Trailer is part of that vehicle. We are starting a trailer fund and need your help. Please put this on your prayer list so it will be in from of our Lord for guidance. ## Raising the Standard of Sponsorship

This information was provided by Roxi Bass on April 12, 2005. In 1997, the Lansing Area Emmaus Community Board of Directors adopted a Sponsorship Policy which contains the following four sponsorship requirements:

- All Sponsors must attend a Sponsorship Training Session prior to sponsoring their first Pilgrim. Training will be offered before Candlelight at every Walk, as a part of monthly Area Gatherings and as requested by other groups who are willing to meet for this purpose.
- The Sponsorship commitment must be renewed every calendar year by signing and submitting the "Annual Sponsorship Agreement" with your first Candidate Reservation for the year.
- Generally, a Sponsor may sponsor no more than two (2) Pilgrims per year.
- A church may sponsor no more than four (6) Pilgrims per Walk.
- Every four years sponsorship is required to be repeated.

You can take Sponsorship Training after the Gatherings and at specific times during a Walk. For more information or for questions regarding Sponsorship Policy and Guidelines, please contact Ned Weller at (989-875-4202).

It is not the intention of the Board to make it more difficult to sponsor someone on a *Walk to Emmaus* but rather to challenge each other to be responsible, purposeful, prayerful, wise and spiritually discerning in sponsoring candidates for a *Walk to Emmaus*.

Reservations for the Fall Men's and Women's Walks are being accepted right now. Contact Pam Wyrick, Lansing Area Emmaus Registrar (989-224-2787) for applications or download the applications from our website www.lansingemmaus.truepath.com And Spring Walk(s) will be here before you know it.

Continued from pg 2. For each local community, the expectation is that Chrysalis and Emmaus will demonstrate the partnership by mutual cooperation and support. The Emmaus Board of Directors adopts bylaws that include Chrysalis as a standing committee. The Chrysalis Standing Committee/Board adopts operating policies and procedures that are in concert with the bylaws of the Emmaus Board of Directors. The Emmaus Board ratifies the Chrysalis operating policies and procedures and thus empowers Chrysalis Standing Committee to operate as the governance agency for Chrysalis, with the operating policies and procedures as one of the governance documents for Chrysalis.

For Emmaus and Chrysalis, each has another governance document, the Letter of Agreement, that each signs every year and submits to the appropriate office of The Upper Room. The fully executed Letter of Agreement provides clear expression of the covenantal relationship between the local community and the International Office and authorizes the community to use the Emmaus or Chrysalis name and materials. Without a current Letter of Agreement, the community does not have the right to use the name or the program materials, all of which are protected by the copyright held by The Upper Room.

Emmaus and Chrysalis each has the responsibility to encourage the other and to adhere to the respective Upper Room model, neither program has the option of shutting down the other one. Such action, if needed, is reserved for The Upper Room Emmaus and Chrysalis offices. The Emmaus Board of Directors should have representatives to the Chrysalis Standing Committee/Board and Chrysalis should have representatives to the Emmaus Board of Directors. For Chrysalis, the representative to the Emmaus Board should be the chair of the Chrysalis Standing Committee/Board. These representatives are ex-officio and ex-officio members have voice and vote. The Emmaus treasurer is responsible for the Emmaus funds. The Chrysalis treasurer is responsible for the Chrysalis funds. At the end of the fiscal year, which needs to be the same for both Emmaus and Chrysalis, the Chrysalis treasurer submits a written report to the Emmaus treasurer regarding the income, expenses, and balance for Chrysalis for that year.
