My Aunt Shirl, not really my aunt, but my mom's neighbor when she was a child, and lifelong friend recently sent me an email about three of God's creatures. It talked about a buzzard, bat and bumblebee. It contained some facts about these animals. It told how the buzzard always takes at least 8 running steps to take off and fly, so will not even try to fly if it is inside a fenced area 10 feet in diameter. The message told of the bumble bee, which, if inside a glass or jar, will not try to fly up, but will continue to fly around and around, never moving up, so remains trapped. It also told how the bat, an extremely agile flyer, cannot take off from the ground, but must drop from some elevation, so if it is on the ground, it cannot fly. It concluded by saying how much we resemble these creatures, and that we need only look up to God, our source of life and all things good.

I liked the conclusion, but I saw several other ways in which my walk is like that of these animals. The buzzard always takes at least 8 running steps, so, even though the pen is open at the top, and the buzzard CAN fly, it won't even try. Freedom only takes the buzzard using the abilities that God gave it. I can imagine the buzzard thinking several things to itself: "I've always taken at least 8 steps before take off, so flying is impossible." "I'm safe and protected right here. There may be predators out there." "What if I try and hit the fence?" The buzzard has this amazing talent that God gave it – the ability to fly. Because it will not even try, it will stay a captive.

The bumble bee's problem is similar to the buzzard. It can fly, and is already flying! All it has to do is use its talent to go up instead of around and around to gain its freedom. The difference with the bumble bee is that it is already flying, and only has to go higher, which is easily

within its ability. Perhaps the bee is thinking to itself, "I know there must be an exit here somewhere, I must just have missed it." "If I keep going around here, I'll find what I missed." If I keep this up, something is bound to change." "At least I'm not stuck on the ground like the buzzard and the bat!"

The bat is stuck on the ground. Perhaps it wanted to see what it was like down there and got trapped, and now must endure what could be a very long and painful struggle to get back to the life in the air.

I see many similarities between these creatures and myself. How many times have I not even tried to use the talents that God gave me out of fear? How many times have I continued in a nice, level existence, cruising around and around on my God-given talents to go nowhere instead of using them and taking flight to live the life that He intended for me? And how many times have I done something stupid and been "grounded," causing myself and others agony?

One other thought was that I have abilities so that, with almost no effort at all, I could alleviate these conditions for each of these creatures. I could open the pen, tip the jar on its side, give the bat a flip in the air (with an EXTREMELY long tool). In relating that to my life, I asked myself, how many times have I failed to do something so simple as to offer a much needed word of encouragement, or offered an hour or so if my time to help another. I pray that God will open our eyes so that we can see the opportunities that He has provided for us, and give us the strength to do as He would have us do.

COMMUNITY BYLAWS

At the January 12, 2007 gathering, the community voted on the proposed bylaws that had been previously published on the website and in the newsletter. Votes were called by Judy McPherson, and independent

dent tallies were kept by Russ Fries and Andy Sass. The final vote was 44 in favor of adopting the proposed bylaws and 0 against adopting them. Final certification of the Bylaws was on the Board agenda for the February 13, 2007 meeting. They were approved unamimously.

WHERE IS YOUR TREASURE?

(A Word from our Spiritual Director)

...store up for yourselves treasures in heaven, where neither moth nor rust consumes and where thieves do not break in and steal. For where your treasure is, there your heart will be also. Matthew 6:20-21

These words from Jesus' teaching in Matthew come from the Sermon on the Mount, a great section of teaching from Jesus, and a very challenging section of scripture. Many times these verses above are connected with storing up monies or wealth or stuff here on earth as opposed to treasures in heaven. And, while this connection is a good one to make, I wonder if there isn't much more to it than that.

The Gospel reading for Ash Wednesday includes some portions of Matthew 6, namely verse 1-6 and 16-21. In these verses Jesus instructs his followers on things such as fasting, and alms giving. He is giving them basic instructions on piety, and he says in verse 1 that we should not practice our piety in front of others in order to be seen by them. In fact, he says, "beware" of doing that, because then you won't be rewarded by your Father in heaven. So, what is going on here? Is it as simple as God's not liking show-offs, so God won't reward you if you do? Perhaps, but that seems a bit trite I think. Maybe there is something else going on. These acts of piety are actually gifts to us, I believe. In fact, in the Methodist tradition, John Wesley viewed acts of giving, praying, and fasting as "means of grace". He believed that through these activities you tapped into a channel of God's grace that would transform you. This means that we are not fasting to impress God or force his hand to do something. That's a good thing, because how could you really impress God? Instead, it is a way for us to nurture and allow growth for that part of us that is in relationship with God. It is a way to develop our spiritual lives.

Lent has traditionally been a time of following Jesus into the wilderness and taking time to pray, connect with God, and grow spiritually. Perhaps, we won't be rewarded if we do these things openly because then we really aren't humbly working on our spiritual selves, but rather we're just trying to impress God or someone else. And if we are not opening ourselves up to these means of grace in an authentic way, then we find ourselves outside of the stream of grace that God is pouring out. Perhaps Jesus is telling us more about what it means to be humans in relationship with God than about a God who is a giant behaviorist, doling out rewards and punishments according to his whims.

So, we have a choice this season. We can ignore the call to develop our spiritual lives and do what we want. We can be pious so that all others can see it, and then really impress them. But both of those things have their rewards here and now. Those choices seem to feed our flesh or feed our pride. There is another choice, and that is to humbly deny ourselves of some things in order to focus on feeding that part of us that is growing in a relationship with God by his grace. At the end of these instructions on piety, Jesus then tells his disciples, don't store up treasures and rewards for yourself here on earth (those are temporary). Store up treasures in heaven. Use this time to make an eternal difference in your life and the lives of others. Remember this season, where your treasure is, your heart is also.

May God bless you on your Lenten journey.

LANSING AREA EMMAUS – BOARD MINUTES – FEBRUARY 20, 2007 PILGRIM UMC—St. Johns

Opening prayer and devotion: The Prayer to the Holy Spirit was led by Andy Sass.

Secretary: Janet Ball. Lyle moved to approve the minutes of the January 9, 2007 meeting. Dave Stinson seconded. Motion carried.

Treasurer: Lyle Ball. Balance reported \$5,193.49. <u>Janet Ball moved to accept the treasurer's report as presented pending audit. Elnora Wallin seconded. Motion carried.</u>

Community Spiritual Director: Rev. Andy Croel No report.

Assistant Community Spiritual Director: Rev. Becky Morrison/Rev. Charlie Farnum. No report.

Assistant Community Lay Director: Kathy Wilson. No report.

Community Lay Director: Andy Sass. CLD attended the first meeting for the Women's Team. He has received and reviewed the Covenant Agreement from Emmaus. This will be signed by the LAE Board of Directors at the March Gathering. Andy has met with Team Selection for assignments of talks for the women's walk and to get potential names for men's walk conference room. Andy has transferred information, etc. to Judy Hazle (Aux/Kitchen Coordinator). He has also checked the bylaws regarding meeting attendance by board members. Information on the LAE website has been updated and the walks have been added to the 3dayol.org website. Andy has contacted Jeff Shultz (Men's LD) and Jeff will begin getting his team set.

Agape – Janet Ball: Women's walk mailroom is full, but still need some help for the Men's walk. There is a need to get some of the cover sheets colored, planning on getting them out to 4th Day Groups.

Auxiliary / Kitchen – Judy Hazle: Eric Harger is the Kitchen Head for the Women's walk. Auxiliary Heads are making calls and getting positions filled.

Data Manager / Newsletter – Harry Wallin: Harry has spent considerable time getting the mailing list updated and ready to go for this mailing. Tom Mason is working on setting up a data base for the community. Harry will be setting up an e-mail mailing list, hoping to cut the cost of the newsletter postage. The February - March newsletter will be a bit late, but the April - May one will be as close to on time as possible. The desk top computer needs servicing. Harry will check into this after the spring walks.

Emmaus Store - Joann McCrum: No report.

Gatherings / Prayer Vigil – Dave Stinson: The March and April Gatherings will be at Pilgrim, but the May Gathering will be at New Life UMC, Six Lakes. There will be a computer on-line and ready for people to sign up for both prayer vigils at the next Gathering.

Outreach – Kathy Wilson: Kathy has revised the sign-up sheet that will be used at the Gatherings. The more detailed one will be

used at the first Gathering after walks to insure the information is correct and can be added to the data base.

Sponsorship / Candlelight / Closing – Russ Fries: Sponsorship Training was conducted at both the January and February Gatherings. Russ has Ray Francis helping with this training. Russ will be using Ray at both walks – to help with the training, candlelight and closing. Andy Sass will contact Ned Weller about obtaining any Emmaus information that he may still have that could help Russ and Ray. There was a discussion about when to have Sponsor's Training at the Gatherings. Holding it after the communion service makes it a very long night. Suggestions were taken and Russ may try something new next time.

Registrar – Terrie Eisenmann: There are 7 men and 10 women registered at this point. There was a Scholarship Request by a woman. Russ Fries moved to grant this scholarship, Harry Wallin seconded. Motion carried.

Supplies / Site – Lyle Ball: Supplies are set. Various churches were mentioned for the fall women's walk site. *Lyle will continue to make calls.*

Team Selection – Elnora Wallin / Judy McPherson: The new Team Selection team is Judy McPherson, Sue Neff, Gordon Galloway, Renee Hahn, Judy Goudie, Alex Goudie and Elnora Wallin.

Other Business:

- Lyle Ball moved to approve the amended LAE bylaws. Harry Wallin seconded. Motion carried.
- This was the first meeting that was held after having members e-mail their reports out to the board. It was decided to do it again next month.
- Janet had updated the Board Members
 Duties/Responsibilities information. The major change was to delete "Music" from the titles, as that job is now divided among Team Selection, Gathering Coordinator and Candlelight and Closing Coordinator.
- 4. There was an appeal from an Emmaus family doing mission work in Mississippi for funds from the area. It was decided that the Board of Directors could not send Emmaus funds for mission work. It was suggested that there be a column in the newsletter informing the community about Emmaus people doing missions here and around the world, which could include contribution information.
- Andy had received an application for an International Lay Director for the Emmaus/Chrysalis movement.
- A discussion was held on placing some of our funds in a short –term CD or other investment opportunity. This was tabled for the March meeting so members could do some fact finding.
- There is a concern that the board lacks communication with the local church Emmaus liaisons. Ideas were discussed, but no action was taken at this time.

The meeting adjourned at 8:40 pm with prayer.
