

SPRING WALKS ARE COMING SOON !!!!!

COMMUNITY LAY DIRECTOR'S LETTER

As everyone, hopefully, by now knows, the Spring 2008 walks are fast approaching. The Men's Walk is scheduled for February 7-10, 2008, and the Women's Walk is scheduled February 21-24, 2008. The walks will be held at Ionia First United Methodist Church, in Ionia.

Please remember that, in an effort to improve our sponsorship of Pilgrims, the board had changed the cut-off dates for applications to Walks. The cut-off date to reach the minimum of 20 Pilgrims is 1 month before the Walk. This means that we have to have at least 20 applications no later than January 7, 2008 for the Men's Walk, and no later than January 21, 2008 for the Women's Walk. Once we hit that minimum, applications will continue to be accepted until the Walk is full or until 2 weeks before the Walk, whichever comes first (FULL!)

Please note that we have expressly opened this Walk to the Grand Rapids community, so we expect it to fill quickly. If you have a pilgrim who is interested in this Walk, I highly recommend that you get your application filed quickly so your Pilgrim does not have to wait! I understand that there were 17 people who took sponsorship training at the gathering November 9. It looks to me like God is blessing this community with people who have Pilgrims in mind for the upcoming walks (I know I do, and expect to have my Pilgrims registered by the time this article is published!)

The Walk Lay Directors are Renee Hahn and Dave Bass, and they are moving forward with their preparation for the Walks.

We are getting many things ready so we can leave for Guatemala on November 10. The weather had been exceptionally warm this fall and therefore we have been busier than usual the last part of October and early November. We had been planning on leaving on the third, but due to several circumstances we have put it off until the tenth.

On the way we want to stop in Chicago to visit a church, and also another church in Houston, before traveling to the border at McAllen, TX to visit friends before crossing into Mexico. Then we want to visit other missionaries in Tampico besides other friends before crossing into Guatemala. We expect to be on the road for a couple weeks, and trust God's protecting hand on us, and special favor with the authorities and at border crossings.

We have sold our diesel-powered motor home to someone in Texas. Since we have the bus to travel to Guatemala there is no need to also have the motor home. After advertising it on the web, someone purchased it to use for transporting people to and from the airport on the U.S. side to his bass fishing resort in Mexico. We will be driving it to Texas for him.

Praise the Lord, our new passports arrived early! It's interesting how we all applied for renewals at the same time, but the new ones were sent to us over a period of several weeks.

We were very blessed by many people coming alongside and helping in various ways. Most importantly we really appreciate the many of you that are praying, and also those that have donated many needed items such as new children's shoes, clothing, baby quilts, etc. Many poor people in Guatemala will be very thankful for your generosity.

Also we had people help us make more improvements on the bus, which are a great blessing. The interior of the bus is now totally redone and the outside also has a new paint job.

Please continue to pray that we can be instruments of God that can glorify Him. I will try to give an update once we get to Guatemala.

Many of you remember Pastor Carl Litchfield, formerly active with both the Lansing Area and Grand Rapids Emmaus Communities. Here is some news of his mission activities.

Dear Friends:

This letter is to let you know that I have felt a call from the Lord to make a second mission trip to the Nation of Bangladesh in 2008. This past January we were able to see three churches planted, witnessed over 500 new Christians baptized, ministered to 305 pastors at the two day Pastor's Conference, and taught 29 Pastors for the new Pastor's School. We need to teach these pastors because they cannot afford Bible College or Seminary Training—their annual income is less than \$300.00 per year.

With God's help Pastors Jan Beaderstadt, Mike Murray, and I will return this coming January to continue teaching the large Pastor's Conference and to teach the original leadership core of pastors in a second year of Pastor's School. We also intend to begin a new class at the Pastor's School and re-teach the first year courses. Last year's courses were Genesis, Judges, the Gospel and Epistles of John, Galatians and Pastoral Care. This year we intend to add Psalms, Mark, Acts, Philippians and Stewardship/Tithing with Entrepreneurial Initiatives. Our goal is to train a core group of pastors, who, at the end of a five-year training program, will train the other Bangladeshi Pastors.

Moreover, we will continue to minister to the 42 girls at Hope House Orphanage in Keshapbur, Bangladesh. We also want to help Pastor Christopher Sarkar, President of the Bangladesh Free Baptist Churches, to help find additional funding to feed and educate these precious girls. Because of the heavy monsoon rains, the girls at Hope House Orphanage have been living on the roof of the orphanage since July. They will be there until some time in December, when the ground is finally dry.

The dates are January 9—January 24, 2008 for this mission trip. The cost of \$4,200.00 includes visa, airfare, all transportation in country, our lodging at the Bangladesh Free Baptist Church, as well as food for all the students and us. Please pray for the success of our mission. I also invite you to prayerfully consider making a financial donation. I have about a month to raise the first \$2,500 for the plane ticket and visa. God is good. With everyone's help last year, the whole project was funded in one month.

If God is leading you to help toward the cost of this trip, checks can be written to Renaissance Outreach Ministries. Any funds raised beyond the cost of the trip will go to help the ministry of the Bangladesh Free Baptist Churches and Hope House Orphanage. Thank you for all you can do.

Agape – Janet Ball: The mailroom is set for the October walk. Janet has updated the manuals with suggestions from the past mailroom heads.

Auxiliary / Kitchen – Judy Hazle: Judy will write a training article for the newsletter. Auxiliary is ready for the fall walk, kitchen area is set. Bill Jenkins did a good job with the auxiliary training. He emphasized the importance of following the Upper Room Emmaus Handbook. Gatherings / Prayer Vigil – Dave Stinson: The attendance at the last gathering was small, but enjoyed by all those that attended. Michelle Gillison presented some new ideas for gatherings that will be implemented next year. The prayer vigil for the October walk is almost full.

Outreach – Kathy Wilson: Kathy will set up some 4th Day, Reunion group testimonies for the next couple of gatherings.

Sponsorship / Candlelight / Closing – Russ Fries: Russ has everything set for the walk weekend. Candlelight times were discussed. We will follow what is on our website:

- The quality of the Pilgrims who have taken Walks leaders in their churches who are being renewed and going back to their churches and out into the world to serve God and His kingdom;
- Pilgrims who took their Walks as recently as the Spring 2007 Walks in Mason have been contacting me and others on the Board about working on Walks, and a number have already served in Auxiliary this Fall;
- A number of community members who have taken their walks within the last 3 years have already served over 72 hours in Auxiliary, and some have been in the conference room as assistant table leaders.

This is awesome! Anyone who was at the November gathering witnessed first hand the fruits of good sponsorship training. Those in attendance filled all of the round tables available, and several rectangular tables that were hastily set up in order to seat everyone; Among those present were pilgrims, sponsors, and team members from the October Walk,

and those preparing for the February Walks; The singing was an amazing praise to the Lord; There was fellowship, praise, an inspiring service, and of course, we broke bread together and shared Communion.

I would ask that we go an extra mile in our sponsorship. One of the big jobs of the sponsor is the family who has not been on a Walk. Please pay special attention to these family members and make the Walk experience positive for them as well – it will make the Walk, and the 4th Day, that much better for your Pilgrim.

Make sure to spend time with the families during the Walk weekend. Answer any questions that they may have. Help them get things done that their spouse would otherwise have done. Report back to them on Sunday before closing, letting them know that you have seen the Pilgrim Saturday night and how they are doing. Follow up with them after the Walk to see how things are going, and if there is anything you can do to support them.

Remember, it is impossible for a sponsor to do the sponsor's job right and well while working the weekend, whether in the conference room or auxiliary. We want the Pilgrims to truly see God's Love, and the sponsors have a large part of presenting that vision. Thank you for your willingness to serve God and His people in this manner!
