

WHAT A WALK!!

COMMUNITY LAY DIRECTOR'S LETTER

The Lansing Area Emmaus Community's Men's Walk to Emmaus finished yesterday. Once again, God worked His wonders on the Walk, and His hands and feet were a huge part of that. The outpouring of love from this community was tangible during the Walk – I know, I was blessed to serve in the conference room. One of the men at the table where I served said he rededicated his life to Christ during the Walk, another said God gave him a direction for the next part of his life, and others said that they planned to make changes in their lives to live out God's will for them, their families, and communities. And that's just one table out of six that had Pilgrims!

This community recently went through some changes in relation to the Walks. We changed the cut off date to have the minimum number Pilgrims signed up (completed applications and initial payment in) for a Walk to go forward to a month before the walk. This community responded, and Pilgrims We had nearly a full men's walk, and there are currently 28 women listed on the website for the upcoming Women's Walk. [Editor's Note: 29 women finished Walk 70, see p. 6]

I understand that there were over 40 people who took sponsorship training on Saturday, during the Men's Walk! From what I have seen and experienced, this community is taking the mission of Emmaus to Heart and trying to truly fulfill God's calling for this Community.

In that light, I would like to make some suggestions for furthering that goal.

If you have a Pilgrim in mind who is having financial difficulties, there is a scholarship available to help them. Do not let the fees stand in the way of a Christian leader who is ready for an Emmaus Walk.

One of the things, as Dave read during closing, is the silent servanthood of those who work behind the scenes on the auxiliary teams. I noticed that during the Thursday evening snack, that community members were greeting each other with questions like, "Are you working this walk?" "What are you doing on the Walk?" While the Pilgrims obviously know, and are even told during the Walk that these things are being done for them, perhaps we would show them agape love, and keep them more at ease, if we did not discuss those things in front of them?

Another matter that came to my attention during the walk is the form of the request for name/walk information. During the walk, we demonstrated love in making those requests, and there were even occasions where someone spoke, sat down, then stood up and introduced themselves, saying that they had just been reminded that they had not introduced themselves. At closing, there were a few shouts of, "NAME!!!" While this may be a fun way of picking on friends, while among friends, it may not be so fun for a Pilgrim. Consider that the Pilgrims are standing in front of their new community of brothers and sisters in Christ. For many Pilgrims this may be the first time in their lives that they are addressing such a large crowd of people. The Pilgrims probably only know a few people, at most, in the Community. They probably want to make a good impression on their new brothers and sisters. They may feel foolish or embarrassed for having forgotten to introduce themselves. To someone in that situation, the shouts may seem rude, or even be intimidating. To such a person, might it not seem as if this were a turn around from a community that had been showing them such love over the previous 3 days? Could it not tell some of the Pilgrims that the love shown during the weekend was nothing more than an act, and not the real nature of the community? I truly pray that we can find a kinder, gentler form of reminder, and continue to show God's agape love to the Pilgrims, and our brothers and sisters in Christ.

Cleopas excitedly told me that three days ago they met a man on the Road to Emmaus that had explained the Scriptures to them. As this man spoke to them, "They found that their hearts seemed to be on fire with His love, compassion and understanding." As they neared the end of their journey to Emmaus, they invited this kind stranger to have dinner with them. Cleopas stated, "At dinner, He took the bread and blessed it, and when he broke it our eyes were opened and we realized that it was Jesus! As soon as we recognized Him, He disappeared." Cleopas added, "We need to keep going as we are on our way to tell others the Good News!"

As part of the Conference Room Team that God formed for Walk #69, I witnessed yet another miracle that only the one true God could perform. God chose a group of Pilgrims and support teams to travel on the Emmaus Road together. On Saturday, after giving up their sins, sharing a candle lit dinner, and later walking into the Presence of the Holy Spirit in the Sanctuary, I believe the eyes of 29 Pilgrim were opened to God's amazing grace and mercy. Who knows . . . maybe they caught a glimpse of Heaven, and truly felt God's incredible love for the very first time.
