

Fruit of the Spirit – Patience

A month or so ago I attended a meeting in Lansing. As usual, it seemed I had too many things to accomplish that day and too little time to get them done. The meeting felt like an intrusion on time better spent on other projects. I showed up at the meeting, I discovered that there were only 3 of us there besides the chairman (there were supposed to be about a dozen of us). We accomplished very little that morning because it's supposed to be an interactive group.

As I left I was impatient, thinking of all the other things I had to accomplish that day and that I now had less time to get done. A short while after I left, I looked up in my rear view mirror and noticed lights flashing. I pulled over, thinking the officer was headed somewhere in a hurry. He stopped also and walked up to my car window. The officer asked me if I knew how fast I was going. I said no, I hadn't been paying attention to my speed. He told me I had been going 52 in a 35 zone. He asked me if I was in a hurry to get somewhere. Impatience got me in trouble, although the officer was polite and didn't give me a citation.

Probably a good definition for impatience would be a greedy tendency to want things *now* and to expect them *sooner* rather than *later*. God places a lot of stock in patience; as a matter of fact, it is one of the fruits of the Spirit. My favorite Bible text bearing with patience has to be one of Paul's; Ephesians 4:1-3 says "I therefore, a prisoner for the Lord, urge you to walk in a manner worthy of the calling to which you have been called, with all humility and gentleness, with *patience*, bearing with one another in love, eager to maintain the unity of the Spirit in the bond of peace." Humility, gentleness and patience, bearing with one another in love! Do you see why they are important? They help us maintain the unity of the Spirit. We have been graciously called into the body of Christ and every member is important to God. When we are impatient with others, we deny the character of our heavenly Father. God longs to make a gift to each of us from His attributes, but all too often we place *ourselves* at the center of our own universe, denying the actions that the Spirit would have us display. Our wants and desires become primary and so we squelch the godly character the Spirit longs to develop in us. Without patience, our witness works against us. How long did God have to wait patiently for you to accept the salvation He offered freely through Christ Jesus?

An impatient person puts their own wishes and needs ahead of everyone and everything else. Doing this doesn't display godly character and love, just the reverse in fact. If I am the center of the universe, an action against me is an affront to my worth, and yet, is that how we see Jesus act? During His passion he didn't answer insults and abuse, except to forgive His abusers. Patience is allowing the Spirit to display Christ in us to the world. It comes in surrendering to the Spirit's leading, and isn't that where we all should be? Take a look at Paul's take on his own importance: 2 Corinthians 12:10 "For the sake of Christ, then, I am content with weaknesses, insults, hardships, persecutions, and calamities. For when I am weak, then I am strong." That doesn't sound anything like my attitude that morning, in hindsight I was even more impatient than I realized! De Colores!

The Board recently had the opportunity to attend the Upper Room Emmaus Training Event for our region. We learned many new things to help us lead the Lansing Area Emmaus Community better.

One thing that was brought to my attention is copyright laws. We need to be very careful to not break any copyright laws when making and distributing Agape gifts to our new Pilgrims. For instance, perhaps a Reunion Group would like to use the famous "Footprints in the Sand" poem written by Mary Stevenson. The group may copy the poem and distribute it as part of their Agape gift. However, this is an infringement upon the copyright held by that author and is punishable under the Copyright Law.

An alternate way for the Reunion Group to distribute this poem would be to purchase a bookmark and then distribute the bookmark as an Agape gift. This distribution of the poem is not a copyright infringement because the group has paid for the use of the poem.

Please pay special attention to copyrights when making Agape. All Agape brought to future Walks will be carefully monitored for Copyright issues and any Agape that appears to be in violation of this law will be returned to the Reunion Group without being distributed to the Pilgrims.
