Proverbs 3:5-6 tells us to trust in the Lord with all our heart, lean not on your own understand, but in all your ways acknowledge Him and He will direct your paths. May God help us all to trust Him a little bit more, follow His directions a little bit more, and acknowledge Him a little bit more.

My name is Becky Morrison. I was raised in a Christian home and was taught to serve God wherever I've been "planted." I was counting on Christ and had seen God at work in my life in many ways. But it wasn't until I took my Walk to Emmaus in November of 1988 in Saginaw that I realized in a personal way that "Christ is counting on me". The Emmaus experience was such a gift and blessing for my life. Like most who have attended a Walk, I gained a deeper understanding of what it means to live as a disciple for Jesus Christ.



I had a terrific sponsor who invited me to be part of her Fourth Day Reunion Group and the women in that group have been

friends ever since. Our group met each Friday morning at 7:00 and, often, we would have a time of prayer at the end that would last one or two hours as we intercede for people, the church, our world – anything God might place on our hearts. We met faithfully and having that accountability made such a difference in my Fourth Day. John Wesley, the founder of Methodism, knew the importance of holding oneself accountable in the Christian walk and the Walk to Emmaus followed through with seeking to have pilgrims do the same. If you are not in a group that meets regularly to support and encourage you in your faith I would encourage you to find or start one. Over the years I have lived in a number of communities in different states and I have always been able to be in a Fourth Day Reunion Group. Gift yourself with that commitment!

Serving the Emmaus community was birthed from my Walk. It was exciting to work behind the scenes making sure everything was clean and in order for the pilgrims. I worked in the kitchen many times as well and was blessed to be head cook on a Chrysalis flight. I was so nervous when I gave my first talk in the conference room as an assistant table leader and, many Walks later, I was so humbled and honored to serve as a Lay Director in 1996 in Traverse City Emmaus community.

The following year, while serving on a Walk with my oldest daughter, she confronted me with the following question: Mother, when are you going to acknowledge your call to be a pastor? For a number of years people would say something about my becoming a pastor, but it wasn't until my daughter confronted me that I admitted that I felt God had been calling me into ministry. I did answer that call, attended seminary, became an ordained elder in the United Methodist Church and have been serving God through pastoral



ministry since 2002. Each Sunday I am so humbled and honored to serve our Lord in sharing God's Good News.

I continue to serve the Emmaus Community, usually working one or two Walks a year and occasionally leading worship at a monthly gathering. Each time I am blessed beyond measure. I have to ask, why wouldn't someone want to serve Christ? I can't imagine not serving in some way.

My Fourth Day has been awesome these past 28 plus years, for deep in my heart, I know without a doubt that "Christ is counting on me and I am counting on Christ." De Colores!

The gentlemen of our church are notified by a recorded message of that Saturday's get together the Thursday prior to the upcoming Saturday morning get together. For those who wish to participate in the Men's Fellowship Group we meet the second Saturday of the month.

At this Saturday's event the men have a wonderful fellowship, devotion and, most of all, a healthy and filling breakfast at a local restaurant Village Kupp.

One of the missions that the Men's Fellowship has undertaken is the "Joshua Ramp" program.

The program provides wheelchair ramps to people of any faith, creed, color, or ability to pay. In the year 2016, the Men's Group installed three ramps and the recipients donated as much as \$500.

When the wheelchair ramp is no longer needed, the men disassemble the ramp and store the materials to be used at the next ramp site. One of the neat features of this program is the fellowship and reaching out to other faiths. In the year 2016, we had assistance in assembling these ramps from the Lakeview Free Methodist Church, Holy Trinity Lutheran Church, and New Hope United Methodist Church members. A unique event the Men's group has done annually is to invite the "significant other" (wife, girlfriend) to a Valentine's Day Breakfast. Fall Emmaus Walks are coming!

You have the power to recharge someone else's Christian journey. Talking about what Christ has done for you through Emmaus can ignite passion and enthusiasm in ourselves and others. Will you pray and ask God, "Who can I have a conversation with, to encourage spiritual growth and testify to the Spirit's desire in me to bring glory to Christ?"

It's been my own experience that those considering attending the Emmaus Walk have heard about it more than once, often needing several conversations with an invitation to go before they say "Yes." I remember the thoughts I had myself when asked to go – uncertainty and even fear! If you've spoken to someone in the past who had a negative response, ask again! Continue to speak with confidence and positive affirmations about the purpose of the Walk, and ask what the person's concerns are. If you don't know how to answer their concerns, discuss them with those in leadership of your Walk: your table leaders, lay directors, spiritual directors, or board members.

Do you know there is scholarship money available up to \$50 per pilgrim, which then would reduce the cost of the Walk to \$30 if registered a month in advance? Ask me, Cindy Iversen (LAEC Registrar), for a scholarship application to be completed by the sponsor. Please don't let money deter you from inviting others. Let the financial need be known to any community member or Board member. Support is available when the need is known. Trust God to provide!

Have you taken sponsorship training within the last two years? If not, just do it, It's offered after every Gathering, both Greenville and St. Johns. Then you will be prepared to respond to the Spirit's promptings to shepherd another on their spiritual journey.


