

As the community prepares for our next Women's Walk in October, we will need to create or provide agape for the team and pilgrims. As a reminder, we provide agape as a physical expression and reminder of God's love. These can come from individuals or groups- yet we do not want to call attention to one individual. So please remember- if you are labelling who the agape gifts are from, it needs to be from a group like a church or Fourth Day. We are praying for a full walk, which would mean we need 65 of each agape. If it is looking like we might have a smaller number, you can reach out to me for a more accurate number- but remember God can still do miracles!

As our community prepares for the upcoming Women's Walk this October, we invite you to join in supporting the team and pilgrims through agape gifts. These simple, tangible expressions of God's love are a cherished part of the Emmaus experience.

Agape can be created by individuals or groups. However, to maintain the spirit of humility and community, we ask that all gifts be labeled from a group like a church, reunion group, or Fourth Day community rather than an individual.

We are praying expectantly for a full Walk, which means we'll need 65 of each agape item. If it appears we may have a smaller group, feel free to reach out to me for a more accurate count. But remember–God is still in the miracle business!

Words from the Board

SHARE GOD'S BLESSING

The Lord said to Moses, "Tell Aaron and his sons, this is how you are to bless the Israelites.

Say to them: 'The Lord bless you and keep you; the Lord make his face shine upon you and be gracious to you; the Lord turn his face toward you and give you peace.' So they will put my name on the Israelites, and I will bless them."

Numbers 6:22-27

This priestly blessing was given by God through Moses to the Israelite priests to be shared with the Israelite community. These verses are known as the Aaronic Blessing, as Aaron was the first chief priest God anointed to be in charge of all the priests overseeing the tabernacle. God was developing the Israelites into a body of believers, helping them to understand who God was and how God desired to be worshiped.

A divine blessing was one way to ask for God's favor to rest upon other people. A blessing shared with others had a purpose to it. It conveyed hope and a reminder of who God was for the Israelites. Aaron's blessing had five parts to the blessing. First was that God would "bless and keep them." That meant God's favor and protection would be upon the people. Second was that God would "make his face shine on them," which meant God would be pleased with them. Third was that God would "be gracious to them," that God would bring his mercy and compassion upon them. Fourth was that God would "turn his face toward them", that God would give the divine approval to them. Fifth was that God would give them a "Godly-type peace," which is greater than human peace. Having this Godly blessing spoken over a person would remind the person that God was with them and would provide for them.

The same is true in today's times. A blessing spoken over a person is a mix of a prayer being offered for them and a reminder that God is with them through the trying times and the good times too. To hear a blessing over and over again helps to cement the idea of God's protection and provision being made available to the person, just because God loves them. Some churches "pass the peace" each Sunday during their worship service. That is the blessing being passed to each person as they go to different people and say, "The peace of Christ be with you," and hear the response of, "and also with you." Sometimes this gets confused with greeting time, as a chance to have a quick conversation with others about how the week has gone.

Sharing a blessing with others is truly an important thing. Sharing the peace of Christ with others is necessary to keep people's faith alive. A church sharing the blessing of peace passes the anointing upon the congregation. Then as they leave the church and go home, to work or school or anywhere else, that peace of Christ goes with them and is shared with others of the community.

As the Lansing Area Emmaus Community continues to prepare for the fall women's walk, the blessing of God should be shared with the volunteers and with the community. How are you doing at sharing the priestly blessing with others? The words of "God bless you" are very important words in keeping the work of the church alive. May God bless you and keep you today!


Words from the Board
